

2024 Smith County Junior Livestock Show Indoor Archery Meet

Entry Requirements

- Enter individually on showman.app (link will be posted on SCJLS website as well) or find instructions to the link on the Smith County Junior Livestock Show (SCJLS) website beginning February 1, 2024.
- Contest Fee – \$40 per equipment class
- Maximum of TWO classes per individual, participants may NOT repeat the same equipment class

District Deadlines

- Registration on showman.app by March 22, 2024, unless maximum number of shooters is met.

Special Accommodations

- Any competitor who requires auxiliary aids or special accommodations must contact the Smith County Junior Livestock Show (SCJLS) office at least 2 weeks before the competition or note such needs when registering.

Entry Divisions (age by January 1, 2024)

- Junior Ages 8-10
- Intermediate Ages 11-13
- Senior Ages 14-18

Note: Youth may register to shoot in an age division higher but may not compete in a lower age division.

Concession

- There will be no concession stand at Griffin Archery. Please prepare before attended contest.

Archery Contestant Rules

Archery (individual entry)

Entry

- Enter as an individual youth on showman.app.

Eligibility

- Participation in the SCJLS Archery Meet is open to all archers that are enrolled in the 4-H, FFA, and FCCLA for the current year.
 - 4-H'ers must be under the supervision of the 4-H Certified archery coach that is listed on the registration document.

Equipment

- Each competitor must provide their own bow and arrows.
- Class Options:
 - Barebow
 - Recurve
 - Compound
 - NASP Genesis® Barebow

Flights

- Archers may shoot in either the morning or afternoon flight.
- Registration is capped at 36 archers per flight. Due to the limited number of archers in each flight, it is recommended to register as soon as registration opens. Flights will close when the maximum number of archers is reached.
- Scores from both flights will be combined upon completion of both flight times with results and awards presented at the conclusion of the afternoon flight.
- **There will be no on-site registration or payment of any kind allowed at the events. Flights may not be added on-site; however, withdrawals will be accepted.**
- All flights are approximately 2-3 hours in length.
- Arrive promptly at check-in time prior to the appropriate flight to go through equipment check, and mandatory orientation.
 - Saturday Morning, 9:00 a.m. check-in, Shooting begins at 10:00 a.m.
 - Saturday Afternoon, 1:00 p.m. check-in, Shooting begins at 2:00 p.m.

Course of Fire

- The match consists of standard FITA (Federation of International Target Archery) targets (9 meter or 18-meter indoor rounds)
- The 9-meter course will be set up for the Junior class ONLY and will consist of 10 ends of 3 arrows each (30 arrows total; 300 points possible).
- The 18-meter course will be set up for Intermediate and Senior divisions and will consist of 10 ends of 3 arrows each (30 arrows total; 300 points possible).

Targets

- Recurve, Barebow, and NASP archers will compete on the 60 cm FITA face and all compound archers will compete on the 40 cm FITA face. The use of 3 Spot targets is the option of the shooter and must be declared with enough time to provide the appropriate target on the range.

Dress Code

- All shooters must wear closed-toed shoes and shirts must have sleeves.

Coaching

- Remember, there is no coaching allowed when archers are on the line.

Scoring

- Targets will be scored utilizing the double scoring system. There will be one scorekeeper scoring on Eyes on Score and one shooter with a scorecard per target, with one range official and one archer acting as scorekeepers. Scores and totals of each end should be verified by each shooter before arrows are touched or removed from the target.
- Any question of scoring should be resolved before any arrow is touched or removed from the target.
- Designated committee members will be stationed at the targets during scoring to ensure archers are verifying each other's scores at time of recording.

Awards

- Awards will be posted on the SCJLS website once finalized.
- Awards and results will be at Griffin Archery on Saturday, March 23rd, at 5:00 p.m.
